The city fully utilized all its resources to provide more transparency and accessibility to local government through modern technology. ### **Better Way Products**

On March 19, 2019 the Valdosta-Lowndes County Development Authority (VLCDA) announced Better Way Products, a subsidiary of Patrick Industries, Inc., an Indiana-based company that designs, engineers, and manufactures fiberglass parts will be relocating in the Azalea City Business Park. Better Way Products, a leader in original equipment manufacturer (OEM) has occupied and leasing the former Robalo building, which remained vacant for over 10 years. With an initial capital investment of \$750,000 in equipment and personal property, Better Way renovated the 217,000-square-foot facility and became operational in Valdosta in April 2019. According to representatives with Better Way Products, approximately 86 employees will be hired within three years. Job opportunities include general labor of fiberglass fabrication, assembling, packaging and administrative support.

Arglass Yamamura noted Valdosta's highly-skilled workforce, affordability, educational infrastructure, and close proximity to markets along the East Coast as determining factors for its specialty manufacturing operations. The Valdosta facility will serve as the company's first U.S. plant, creating glass products based on the company's founding principles of flexibility, efficiency, and sustainability. # \$2.5 MILLION INVESTMENT BY CJB IN 2019

### CJB Applied Technologies

CJB Applied Technologies, LLC, an affiliate of CJB Industries, Inc. held an expansion ceremony with a blessing of the grounds and foundation on Tuesday, November 12, 2019. In 2018, CJB Applied Technologies announced they were moving out from under the umbrella of CJB Industries into a standalone facility to support continued growth in applied research and development in chemical and biological markets. The new facility will be approximately 10,000 square feet and house labs, small greenhouse for testing and a nature walk. The construction is expended to be complete in summer of 2020 with a master plan to allow for 3 additional buildings in the future. This project represents a capital investment of \$2,500,000 into the local community. CJB plans to create up to 10 new jobs with the addition of CJB Applied Technologies, LLC. CJB Applied Technologies, LLC, will be located at 1105 Innovation Way located inside Miller Business Park.

#### Ace Electric, Inc.

At the December 2019 Valdosta-Lowndes County Development Authority (VLCDA) Board of Directors meeting, the board voted and approved the development agreement that benefits the growth and expansion of Ace Electric, Inc. Ace Electric, Inc. will expand their footprint in Valdosta-Lowndes County with additional capital investment and new jobs. Ace Electric, Inc. will build a new fabrication facility located in Westside Business Park to support their industrial and commercial customers. Construction on the 70,000 square foot facility is schedule to begin in March of 2020. Newly created jobs will consist of a shop manager, electrical material assemblers, electrical design detailers, BIM technicians, senior BIM operators, truck drivers and laborers. Positions will be posted on the Ace Electric, Inc. website at www.aceelectric.net/ employment.com in October 2020. The new facility will create 15 new jobs in Valdosta-Lowndes County, with an average wage of 18 to 20 dollars an hour. They will invest \$5.5 million into the facility.

# FAVING THE WAY for a Great Future

The Engineering Services Division had a busy year, completing the resurfacing of 19 streets (5.33 miles) and addition of 5540 feet of new sidewalks.

### Patterson Street Streetscape

The Project extends from Magnolia Street to Gordon Street and consisted of beautification and revitalization of the public right-of-way along North Patterson Street to match other areas of Downtown. The work included sidewalks, curb ramps, sod, trees, shrubs, waste receptacles, pedestrian benches, and decorative brick pavers.


"Patterson is one of the welcoming corridors into the city and this project helped with our goal of connecting downtown to VSU and making this connection pedestrian friendly," says Project Manager Kevin Tolliver.

### Williams Street Sidewalk Improvements

This project consists of adding 1,000 feet of 10-foot wide sidewalk between Park and Woodrow Wilson. The sidewalk completed the Azalea City Multipurpose Trail. In addition curb and gutter and drainage pipe was installed on each side replacing ditches. The new paving and striping completed the project.

### Baytee & Alden Intersection Improvements

This intersection had a shared lane for vehicles proceeding straight into Remerton and turning right towards the mall. This caused delays for traffic who were there to turn right towards the mall. The project widened Alden, and striped it for a sole right turn lane. It was lengthened as well to serve more cars. The intersection was repaved and the striping was refreshed.



Residents of Valdosta will soon have an accurate and objective assessment of the city's pavement infrastructure. In 2019, The City of Valdosta worked with a professional third-party contractor, Infrastructure Management Services (IMS), to optimize the taxpayer funds dedicated to infrastructure management. MS was responsible for completing an objective pavement condition survey. The IMS survey team operated their state-of-the-art "Road Surface Tester" in Valdosta. This vehicle is outfitted with a suite of lasers, cameras, computers, and GIS tracking technology that allowed the IMS team to accurately and objectively measure the surface conditions on Valdosta's roadways.






# DEPARTMENT OF Finance

Although the city's FY 2020 budget was approximately \$99 million, approximately \$11.8 million of it was generated from property taxes. The largest sources of revenue in the city are sales taxes, water and sewer fees, sanitation fees, franchise fees and property taxes.


\$99 MILLION 2020 ANNUAL BUDGET

# Public Safety

### Fire Department

In 2019, VFD offered its first nationally certified Apparatus Operator course. Twenty four Emergency Medical Technicians recertified in 2019 keeping the department at approximately 75% medically trained. A car seat technician class was delivered, adding 6 new technicians to the department.

The Fire Prevention Division conducted 1059 Fire Inspections, 61 CO (Certificate of Occupancy) Inspections and 36 building sprinkler plan reviews; while finding over 218 fire and life safety violations. The division is also responsible for conducting and coordinating over 102 pre-incident surveys, installed over 128 smoke detectors and over 100 community educational programs.

The training division reached its goal of ensuring 100% of all members were Firefighter II Certified. This will help with maintaining the Class 1 ISO rating. Firefighters participated in over 28,000 hours of training locally and through the partnership with Georgia Fire Academy, 12 employees received their Fire Officer Certifications.

### Police Department

In 2019 the department revamped our recruitment process. The team was changed up to show a more diverse group, to include addressing the department's tattoo and facial hair policy. The department added different job fairs to the list that were previously attended, as well as getting officers to attend Moody AFB TAP program, where members of our recruitment team speak with Moody personnel who are leaving the military. The department worked with the City of Valdosta PIO and developed new and updated hiring pamphlets.

This year our department received an upgrade with the previous body cameras. This upgrade allowed for not only software improvements, but also hardware improvements. These cameras have a longer battery life and they are more user friendly.

The department received replacement in-car computers for half of the patrol fleet. The previous computers were no longer under warranty and there was a lot of the computers that were failing. These new computers have the most current software options. They are also covered under complete warranty for the next three years. These computers have improved our officers' workstations.

VPD is an internationally accredited law enforcement agency. The department employs approximately 159 certified police officers and 41 civilians in administrative, record, and police aide positions.

# Water Matters!

The Utilities Department would like to thank the Valdosta, Lowndes County community for allowing us to serve the potable needs of our customers, provide essential firefighting infrastructure, as well as protect and preserve the community's eco-system. Working together, Valdosta has rebuilt from the forces of major rain events, controlled floodwaters, and withstood extended power outages. Throughout these events, the women and men of the department maintained, without interruption, water, sewer, and fire prevention services. These investments include power generation through emergency generators, as well as enough on-site solar power to sustain operations at both wastewater treatment facilities. Together, the seven divisions comprising the Utilities Department stand ready to meet the uncompromising expectations our community deserves.

In 2019, the sewer rehabilitation program continued with over 3,000 linear feet of sewer main being completed utilizing Cured-In-Place-Pipe (CIPP). This process renews old terra-cotta pipe which has cracked or collapsed, thus

restricting sewer flow. The renewal extends the life of the pipe for an estimated 30 years and is a fraction of removal and replacement costs.

Also, 2,844 feet of sewer main was replaced and upsized as part of the Supplemental Environmental Program (SEP). This project identified six high-priority problem areas and bottlenecks in the sewer system. To date, five of those projects have been completed with the sixth currently underway.

The department continued the Wireless SCADA System project which allows secure, real-time remote monitoring and control using cellular data transmission. All three plants have been upgraded with this new SCADA. All lift stations are scheduled for completion by May 2020. Additionally, emergency generators have been installed at ten additional lift stations in case of utility power grid failure.

### WITHLACOOCHEE SEWER PLANT 2019 Accomplishments

- The injection point for the sodium bisulfite solution application at the effluent monitoring station was moved from the original location buried 6 feet below ground level to a more accessible location to accommodate maintenance and repairs as needed. Also, we can now monitor the chemical feed location for proper operation and adjust as needed.
- Replaced filtration cloths on all disc filters in the (3) filter chambers. We are seeing improved backwash/cleaning of the filters for increased flow handling capability.
   Replaced all 6-inch check valves on the waste activated sludge lines of the sequencing batch reactor basins. This eliminated the backflow issues into the basins and the inconsistent flows during the waste cycles of each basin.
- Installed new VT SCADA system in the plant control room for improved plant operations control and monitoring.
- All plant operators are now certified with a minimum GA
   Class 3 Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator license.

### MUD CREEK SEWER PLANT 2019 Accomplishments


#### WITHLACOOCHEE WATER PLANT

The Withlacoochee Wastewater Treatment Plant provides the city with state-of-the-art wastewater treatment for an average daily flow of 4.2 million gallons per day, with the capability to treat peak flows of 18 million gallons per day.



### CENTRAL MAINTENACE 2019 Accomplishments

- Installed standby diesel generators at 11 lift station; ensures critical backup power; reduces likelihood of station failure during storms and power outages.
- Purchased a 4" portable diesel diaphragm pump for Withlacoochee Wastewater Plant maintenance; increases maintenance & repair capabilities and reduces downtime; can be used at both wastewater plants and anywhere else the City requires high solids content water removal.
- Purchased one towable 34' boom manlift for use at all plants and lift stations; cuts contracting costs while expediting repair and maintenance procedures



# 8,200 DOWNTOWN JOBS IN 2019

#### **Business & Investment**

Since completion of the streetscape project in 1998 downtown has seen over \$80 million in private investment.

In 2019 we welcomed 7 net new businesses that brought approximately 42 net new jobs and \$4.2 million of investment to our downtown.

### They're Back! Join a Neighborhood Action Association



### 315 DIGITAL PLANS IN NEW SYSTEM

#### Modern and Mobile!

The City brought a new, modern digital experience to residents when it launched its new website in May 2019. Making it easier to find information from any desktop, tablet, or phone, the site features a mobile friendly, responsive design as well as improved navigation, quick links on popular topics, and a clean attractive appearance. The site was designed by the Public Information Office. Additionally, City staff were consulted through the re-design process.

### The Municipal Court Work Alternative Program

The Municipal Court had approximately 5 Work Alternative Program (WAP) participants. Since the WAP implementation in June 2001, approximately 112,328 work hours have been completed on various municipal projects, saving the city \$767,700 in jail housing fees.

#### Recruiting & Retaining the Best

The City of Valdosta created a new video series in 2019 titled 'Next-Gen Valdosta'. The videos will be produced by the city's Metro 17 staff. The video series is aimed at educating citizens about the next generation workforce for the City of Valdosta. 'Next-Gen Valdosta' is showcased on the city's website and on social media. The goal is to reach citizens and bring awareness to the different positions and career paths shown in the videos.

### New! Plan Review Goes Digital

In January 2019, the Building Inspections Department implemented a digital plans review process. So far it has been a great success! The Department reviewed 315 plans in 2019 with the new system.

### City Marshals Go High Tech

Valdosta City Marshals revamped how they oversee the community by going high tech. All city marshals are now working off tablets, nearly eliminating their time in the office. The new system allows marshals to get on the ground and in the community, allowing for more time working with citizens, and ultimately making Valdosta a safer, cleaner place for everyone. City marshals are now spending eight hours of their day in the field, responding to complaints and patrolling communities.

#### Neighborhood Walks with VPD

The Valdosta Police Department is knocking on doors in an attempt to knock down barriers as the department hosted a new neighborhood walk initiative in 2019. There have been a number of new initiatives over the last year to get the police department more involved in the community, and to get people within the community working with each other more. The neighborhood walk is the newest installment of the effort to make communities a little bit safer.

### Love Where You Live program expands to Valdosta City Schools!

The Public Works Department installed 12 trash receptacles throughout the City last year to help provide an avenue for pedestrians to dispose of their litter. Litter still continues to be a major problem today. This year, the Public works Department focused its efforts towards educating the communities youth on the benefits of clean surroundings. To continue our efforts, The Public Works Department and Neighborhood Development Department partnered together to kick off the "Love Where You Live "campaign at S. L. Mason Elementary School. Staff from both departments performed a small skit of what littering can do to the environment and educated them on the benefits of keeping their surroundings clean. Two trash receptacles painted with Wildcat themes were installed at the entrance of the school to help motivate the students to pitch in and promote the "Love Where You Live "campaign.

#### Downtown is a GEM!

Valdosta was once again designated as a Georgia Exceptional Main Street (GEMS) program by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs and National Main Street Center.

The Valdosta Main Street office and Coleman Talley received an award from the Georgia Downtown Association (GDA) for its rehabilitation of 109 South Ashley Street in Downtown Valdosta. The building project was granted Best Adaptive Reuse over 10,000 square feet in the economic development category, noting the historic buildings' return to productive use while maintaining architectural integrity.

### Live Work Play, VALDOSTA!

The city of Valdosta is one of nine recipients of the 2019 Live, Work, Play Award given by the Georgia Municipal Association (GMA) and Georgia Trend magazine. Valdosta was highlighted for constantly restoring its downtown and continuing to move forward in all things Live, Work, Play. Judges noted the city has done a successful job with historic tax credits, creating industry jobs, and employment opportunities. Judges also credited the city's collaboration efforts and schools.

#### Other Accolades

- Maintained one of the lowest millage rates in the state for the citizens of Valdosta, currently 7.809 mills.
- Awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting in 2019 for 33 consecutive years and the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for 22 consecutive years.
- Maintained the VPD's "Triple Crown Accreditation" for attaining three voluntary accreditations, two for law enforcement and one for the crime laboratory.
- Received national accreditation for the Valdosta Main Street Program for the 33nd consecutive year for meeting commercial district revitalization standards set by the National Trust Main Street.
- Designated a Tree City USA community by the National Arbor Day Foundation for its 33 consecutive years.


The app also features buttons on the home page where users can pay their utility bill online, read city news, visit the city's website, and contact VPD for non-emergency calls.
