Residents Urged to Participate in Electronics Recycling Event

Spring is the time of year when residents typically take advantage of the warmer weather to complete several spring cleaning chores that can help reduce unnecessary clutter around their homes.

The community e-recycling event allows residents who want to properly dispose of their outdated or unwanted electronic equipment on Saturday, April 7, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., in the Mathis Auditorium parking lot, located at 2300 N. Ashley Street.

Items that will not be accepted include vacuum cleaners, refrigerators, washers, dryers, gas-powered equipment, non-electronic equipment and other non-recyclable items. This event is one of two annual e-recycling events and other year-round efforts that support the city's recycling program. It is open to all Lowndes County residents.

Conserve water and save money this spring

In the home

Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth. Water comes out of the average faucet at 2.5 gallons per minute.





Try using slow watering techniques such as drip irrigation or soaker hoses.

In the yard



Only run the washing machine and dishwasher when it is full.

Conserve your water!





Use a rain barrel to

collect rain and water

your plants.

Fix dripping faucets and running toilets. A leaky faucet drips at a rate of one drop per second which waste up to 2,700 gallons per year.



Adjust sprinklers, so they do not water paved surfaces.





Take shorter showers. Replace your shower head with a more efficient alternative, so you can reduce water and energy use.




Pools can lose up to 4,000 liters of water per month due to evaporation. A pool cover can reduce this loss.

Valdosta's Oldest House to be Considered as an Events Center

The Valdosta Heritage Foundation Board of Directors voted at their February meeting to make Valdosta's oldest house available to a private entity to be used as a premiere indoor and outdoor events center, provided the land use is approved by the Valdosta City Council.

Following the fire on Jan. 26, 2011 that severely damaged the Roberts House, the Valdosta Heritage Foundation raised the required funds to restore the historic home. Since then, however, the foundation had not completed the interior restoration because they were studying the best use for the house.


