Tickets are on sale for the 2018 Bird Supper, scheduled for Wednesday, Jan. 31, 2018 at the historic Georgia Railroad Depot in Atlanta, beginning at 5 p.m. The traditional event, sponsored by the Lowndes County Board of Commissioners and the City of Valdosta, brings together hundreds of state officials and local business, professional and government personnel for a dinner of quail and important conversations.

Since the 1950s, the Bird Supper has been providing a venue for local professionals to be a catalyst for impacting legislative issues by keeping Valdosta and Lowndes County in the minds of the state officials during a half-way point of the legislative session.

Report Stormwater Pollution

Only stormwater is allowed to enter into a stormdrain. The discharge of any polluted water, sewage, oil, paint, etc., is strictly prohibited. Help protect our community's waterways by reporting stormwater pollution when you see it.

When to make a report:

- When you see someone illegally dumping anything into a storm drain, ditch or waterway.
- When you find disposed waste in or near any storm drain, ditch or waterway.
- When you notice unusual odors in or near the storm drain.
- When you see sediment coming off a construction site.
- When the drainage system has unusually large flows during a dry period.
- When you are aware of suspected stormwater pollution that may impact public health or the environment.

Valdosta Begins Homeless Count Locally

The Valdosta Neighborhood Development Division coordinated the 2018 Georgia Homeless Count for Valdosta and Lowndes County, part of a statewide effort through the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA) to determine the number of homeless families and individuals in Georgia.

"It is important for our community to

count our homeless annually. Our local continuum of care, which is made up of city and county organizations, cannot provide the needed services because of a lack of resources," said Neighborhood Development Director Vanassa Flucas. "An accurate count will allow our local community organizations, who provide these services, to apply for competitive

grant funding with the larger communities across our state who are applying for the same federal and state dollars."

The data for the 2018 Georgia Homeless Count will specifically focus on people's housing status on the night Jan. 22, and data collection will continue through Jan. 29. The results of the count will be available in late Spring 2018.

Valdosta 101 is designed to give Valdostans and other local citizens a deeper understanding and appreciation of their local government by exposing them to all city departments and other community leaders. The program, an initiative of the Valdosta Mayor and City Council, also includes the participation of up to five high school seniors who have a parent or legal guardian also enrolled in the program.

An applicant for Valdosta 101 must be a legal resident of the United States, complete a separate Criminal History Form and undergo a background investigation as part of the application process.
