City Assists Local Homeowners with \$306K Grant

The City of Valdosta recently received a \$306,000 grant for homeowner rehabilitation from the Georgia Department of Community Affairs (DCA)—part of over \$5.1 million in grants to local communities and nonprofit organizations under the state's FY 2011 Community HOME Investment Program (CHIP). The grant is also part of the \$16.8 million in grant funding that the city has received over the past three years for community improvements.

The city's CHIP program will use the funds to continue the current program and to provide 24 income-eligible, owner-occupied households within the Designated Revitalization Area (DRA) with rehabilitation/reconstruction assistance. The city is pleased to once again receive the support from DCA through these CHIP funds to continue its focus on the rehabilitation and reconstruction of existing owner-occupied homes with the city's DRA. Valdosta has an outstanding track record of securing and administering these funding resources in support of our state and national award winning housing initiatives.

Since the city began receiving CHIP funding in 1998, the program has assisted 158 families with funding to purchase their first homes or complete much-needed home Continued on page 2

repairs to make their homes decent, safe and sanitary. Inclusive of the recent awarded grant, the city has received nearly \$2.8 million to date in CHIP funding for these housing improvements.

In 2001, the city was designated by Habitat for Humanity International as a 21st Century Challenge Community and has set the year 2020 as the goal for eliminating all substandard housing within the city limits. CHIP funding, along with our Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement funding, will continue to be instrumental in helping the city achieve this goal.

Don't FOG Up the Holidays

The holidays are here so remember your environment as you prepare for all your holiday meals. Many of the foods today have some form of fat, oil, or grease (FOG) in them that can impact both the sanitary sewer and stormwater systems if not disposed

of correctly. Here are a few tips on how to safely dispose of FOGs:

- Never pour fat, oil or grease down the drain.
- Allow the oil to cool completely.
- Decide whether the oil needs to be discarded. Oil used for deep-frying can usually be reused several times.
- To properly discard oil, carefully place it into a strong sealable container and then place it in the trash. Save sealable plastic jars or old coffee cans for disposing of old grease in the future.


