Thanksgiving Safety

Thanksgiving Facts:

Thanksgiving is the leading day for home fires involving cooking equipment, with three times the average number.

According to data from the USFA, an estimated 2,000 Thanksgiving Day fires in residential buildings occur annually in the United States, resulting in an estimated average of five deaths, 25 injuries, and \$21 million in property loss each year.

The leading cause of all Thanksgiving Day fires in residential buildings is cooking.

These fires occur most frequently in the afternoon hours from noon to 4 p.m.

Smoke alarms were not present in 20 percent of Thanksgiving Day fires that occurred in occupied resi-

dential buildings.

Local Statistics

In 2016 on Thanksgiving Day, VFD responded to a total of 10 calls of which one was a house fire, one was a fire alarm, two were grass fires and the rest were a number of other good intent calls.



Safety Tips

- Ensure that you have working smoke alarms throughout your home.
- Never leave cooking unattended.
- If you plan on using a

turkey fryer, be sure that you have read all the instructions before use.

- Heat cooking oil slowly and watch it closely; it can ignite quickly.
- It is a good idea to have a fire extinguisher handy in your home and ready for use at all times.
- Keep oven food packaging and other combustibles away from burners and heat sources.

Always Remember

- Don't wear loose sleeves while working over hot stove burners - they can melt, ignite or catch on handles of pots and pans spilling hot oil and other liquids.
- Never use a turkey fryer indoors or on decks.
