Summer Safety

Summer Facts:

More than one in five drowning victims are children 14-years-old and younger, and most incidents happen when a child falls into a pool or is left alone in the bathtub.

Each year about 30 people are injured as a result of gas grill fires and explosions.

Properly-fitted helmets can reduce the risk of head injuries by at least 45 percent – yet less than half of children 14 and under usually wear a bike helmet.

Unintentional falls are the leading cause of non-fatal injuries for children in the United States. In 2013, unintentional falls resulted in nearly 2,578,235 injuries requiring treatment in an emergency room.

Local Statistics:

In 2016, VFD responded to 4 outside equipment fires in which property damage totaled \$20,350.



Safety Tips:

- Find age-appropriate swim lessons for your child, but keep in mind that lessons do not make your child "drown-proof"
- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.

- Wear a properly-fitted helmet. It is the best way to prevent head injuries and death.
 - Take your kids to playgrounds with shock-absorbing surfaces such as rubber, synthetic turf, sand, pea gravel, wood chips or mulch.

Always Remember

- Never leave your child unattended around water.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
