



# Get Ready! Preparing Your Community For A Disaster

#### **Disaster Facts:**

Between 2000 and 2012, natural disasters caused \$1.7 trillion in damage and affected 2.9 billion people.

Over 1/2 of the victims of both Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Sandy were senior citizens over the age of 65.

Today, more than ever, first responders and local residents must work together to prepare their cities and towns for disaster.

Recent disasters have taught us that no single preparedness tool is more important than a plan: an understanding of what to do, where to go, and how to survive in a disaster.

Severe weather and storms can cause power outages and restoring power can take time.

# **Local Statistics**

In 2016, VFD responded to 50 reported severe weather and natural disaster calls.—When hurricanes and tornadoes strike in our area, VFD can respond to well over 100 calls in a single day.



# **Safety Tips**

- Keep your emergency supplies kit, including water, ID, stored in an easily accessible, waterproof place.
- Stay away from downed power lines.

- If advised to do so, please evacuate your home and go to local shelters ahead of a disaster strike.
- Do not return home until local authorities say it is safe to do so.

# Always Remember

- Stay informed of weather conditions.
- Check on neighbors or anyone who may need assistance.
- Conserve energy to help reduce the threat of a power outage.
- Be prepared to cook outside.
- Back up computer files regularly.
- Keep cars fueled up.
