

# Human Resources Director Message

There is a love/hate relationship with email. But, as with any technology, there's a downside. There are plenty of stories about an accidental "reply all" or inadvertent "forward" that caused embarrassment. We all know that emails can be misinterpreted.

An emailed message lacks vocal tone, facial expression, and body language—all those cues we get through face-to-face communication. Taking the time to make sure your emails are clear and concise is well worth the effort. There are, however, times when you must forgo email and deliver a message in-person or, at the very least, over the phone.

1. Angry or irritated? It's never wise to send any message until you've cooled off and can communicate clearly and professionally. Along the same lines, if someone's sent you a scathing email, avoid the temptation to respond in kind and instead, pick up the phone and say I got your email and thought it best if we have a conversation since so much can be

misinterpreted via email and I'd like us to resolve this.

2. Concerned that your message might hurt the other person's feelings? Perhaps you're giving feedback or critiquing a proposal. It's tempting to avoid dealing with the potential emotional fallout by sending an email. Do the right thing and speak to him/her face-to-face.

3. Some people take pleasure in peppering emails with snarky observations, belittling comments, or other damaging statements they would never say in person. So, if your email contains something you wouldn't say to the recipient directly, delete it. If you need to apologize, please don't even consider doing it via email. Deliver your apology in person or, if that's not possible, call the person. You won't be sorry.
