Not Every Hero Wears a Cape, Plan and Practice Your Escape

Fire Facts:

One-third of American households who made an estimate, thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become lifethreatening. The time available is often less.

If a fire breaks out in your home, you may have only a few minutes to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds.

According to an NFPA survey, only one of every three American households have actually developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.


While 71% of Americans have an escape plan in case of a fire, only 47% of them have practiced it.

Only 8% of people in those households said their first thought on hearing a smoke

alarm would be to get out!

Safety Tips

 Make a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss this plan with everyone in the home.



- PRACTICE your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice yearly.
- Know at least two ways out of every room.
- Make sure all windows and doors leading outside operate easily in

case of emergency.

- Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if there is a fire.
- CLOSE doors behind you as you leave the home to prevent fire, smoke, and heat spread.
- Install smoke alarms inside every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
- Make sure your house numbers are easily seen from the street.
